My Health Record

An electronic summary of an individual's health information that **can be shared securely online** between the individual and registered healthcare providers involved in their care to support improved decision making and continuity of care.

Australians value our **high quality** healthcare practitioners and workers, and generally experience **affordable** and **accessible** care

- Couldn't get an appointment




The **top three** activities people want to be able to do on their mobile device:

Allied Health – what's in it for me and my patients?

Access to key health information

Through My Health Record system you can access information about your patients such as:

- Hospital Discharge Summaries
- Shared Health Summaries (which include medications, medical history, allergies and immunisations)
- Event Summaries [include information regarding a significant health event]
- . MBS and PBS history up-to-date medications
- · Medication prescription and dispense records

Further, if you have compliant software, you will also be able to upload information about your patients which can then be viewed by hospitals and other healthcare providers involved in their care.

Greater efficiency

Having access to a patient's key health information can help you operate more effectively by allowing you to:

- Quickly gain a picture of the health history of your patient
- Reduce the time you spend sharing and following up to receive information about your patients with other healthcare providers [e.g patients with chronic diseases]
- Access the same information about a patient whether you are working in the public or private setting.












Navigation panel

Log in to Provider Portal




The My Health Record Provider Portal allows you to search on and view individual digital health records through your web browser. To access the Provider Portal you must first <u>register</u> and obtain the appropriate credentials.

If you are an existing user of the My Health Record system you can login to the Provider Portal here.



If you are using a conformant clinical information system and you have obtained your digital credentials you and your staff can access the My Health Record system through your software. You can find more information on <u>conformant systems</u> **2**.








Accessing information via the Provider Portal




Under the drop down menu item 'Medicine Records', the Medicines Information view is the first menu item.

Create Event Summaries


Shared Health Summary	Event Summary
Changing medication	When communicating with other healthcare providers significant healthcare event that is relevant to the ongoing care of the patient eg:
adding diagnosis or procedure	indicating a clinical intervention
adding allergies/adverse reactions	improvement in a condition
adding immunisation	treatment has been started or completed.

An **Event Summary** can be uploaded by any healthcare provider with a (HPI-I) who is working at a participating healthcare organisation and involved in the patient care.



View and Create eReferrals



eReferral historical info

- An eReferral is a computer generated referral in a standard format.
- eReferral letters standardise the information included.
- eReferrals use the Healthcare Provider Directory to identify specialists and AHP's.
- Benefits include:
 - Timely communication between GP's and Allied Health
 - Administrative efficiencies
 - Improved confidentiality
 - Delivery confirmation

Consent and My Health Record

Do I need my patient's consent to upload an Event Summary?

No. In registering for the My Health Record system, patients provide all healthcare providers 'standing consent' to upload clinical information. There is no requirement to obtain consent on each occasion prior to uploading clinical information. There is also no requirement for the patient to review the Event Summary before it is uploaded to their My Health Record.

The Australian Medical Association (AMA) states that it is good medical practice to advise a patient that you will be uploading information to their My Health Record, particularly if this information might be considered sensitive. See section 4.5 of the AMA's Guide to using the PCEHR.


